AN ORDINANCE

TO REGULATE UNLICENSED, ABANDONED OR
INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE CITY OF
CHESNEE.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Mayor and Councilmen of the
City of Chesnee, South Carolina, in council assembled:

SECTION 1: The having, parking or placing of any motor
vehicle which does not have a current motor vehicle license upon
any property located within the City of Chesnee is hereby
declared to be a public health hazard and a nuisance and the
owner of the property on which such vehicle is located shall be
guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2: It shall be unlawful for the owner of any
vehicle not having a current motor vehicle license to park or
leave same in a public street or any right of way of a public
street or on any public property. In the event such a vehicle
remains on a public street or right of way or on public property
for a period of more than 48 hours, such motor vehicle shall be
deemed abandoned and may be seized and removed for safekeeping by
the Chief of Police in a manner provided for by state law.

SECTION 3: It shall be unlawful for any person to
salvage or otherwise maintain upon his property any inoperable
motor vehicle for the purpose of taking parts therefrom.

SECTION 4: Provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to any motor vehicle which is the subject of litigation in any court of this state and shall not apply to motor vehicles located on the place of business of any licensed new or used car dealer, or in those cases, where the unlicensed or inoperable vehicle is covered or sheltered in such fashion as is adequate to prevent moisture from accumulating.
